Because of God's mercy, we continue to minister in W. and E. Ukraine.

New churches have been opened in two regions of E. Ukraine. People are seeking the Lord, although not in the large numbers we saw at the beginning of this decade. It seems that the time for large crusades is gone but people need the Lord and continue coming to Him.

Right now we especially need full-time Christian workers, dedicated to the mission field. In our ministry we are doing everything possible to reach everyone in the surrounding regions by preaching the gospel. Each church is sending out evangelistic groups to the villages around it. The Berezova Rudka village church holds services in four nearby villages. The mother church in Priluki sends ministry teams to hold services in adjoining counties, 3 services in one area and one near Kiev. The teams go even if there are just a few people who want to hear.

Our Goal is to preach the Word and minister to people's needs. God blessed us in Priluki and we have the privilege of worshipping in a nice spacious building. Of course we were helped by many brothers and sisters to prepare it, however it is not finished. Between services we

continue to work, finishing the construction on our Christian Center and after that we plan to hold a missionary training school for those who wish to minister in E. Ukraine. We are very excited that God has opened the door for our church to teach Bible classes in public school #9. This is a ministry with great results and which we pray will further open doors to families in the area.

In W. Ukraine, the annual Bible School has been going on since April. There are 25 students preparing for full-time work. The previous class of 2009 opened 7 mission stations in Ukraine and Russia. Each of these pioneer missionaries, leaving their jobs and living in new areas, goes into challenging situations. God brought some of the men and women students together into marriage so they are not alone.

Peter and Dina are one example. After graduating from the Mission Training in 2008, Peter preached in two regions of Ukraine. After their wedding, his wife joined him there.

Ivan and Diana have a newborn and are working in a village. They have eight people in their church who are building a house for the church. Oleg B and wife Vera, went to Irkutsk, Russia (Siberia). Though it is a stark region, they do not have any regrets as many people are coming into the kingdom, which gives them great joy.

Rostik Borishkevich, director of Good Samaritan in Ukraine says, *"Fruitful mission work depends upon your prayers – especially against attacks of Satan, in the form of discouragement. A large part of mission work is your financial support. Don't forget that they have sacrificed their personal goals and plans in order to go."*

Peter, Yuriy and a musical team traveled in Ukraine in May and June. They experienced a multitude of ministry experiences and say it was a most blessed trip. For two weeks they held evangelistic services every day of the week, sometimes holding two services per day. Their most memorable service was held for 10,000 people in the pouring rain, with everyone standing on the muddy ground. The people were walking, standing, kneeling and weeping in the rain and mud but everyone was touched by

the Lord. At every service on the trip, people came to the Lord.

They visited prisons, rehab centers, a widows' home, a gypsy church and participated with Reinhard Bonnke in his Kiev crusade.

All of our Ukraine missionaries gathered in Priluki for a reunion of about 300 people.

Our E. India pastor friend Adji and his wife, a gifted soloist, and a Pakistani missionary traveled with Peter and Yuriy. The Ukrainians were fascinated at seeing them but also donated out of their hearts for the ministry in those countries.

Our mission in Rivne was able to completely finish and furnish the fourth floor conference room with new chairs. We were able to hold our

annual Mission Anniversary celebration, the 21st in the facility. We are so excited for the many possible uses it presents. One idea is to gather the University students there for a service each week.

All in all the mission trip was an exciting time for the Kingdom of God and everyone was blessed who took part in it.
