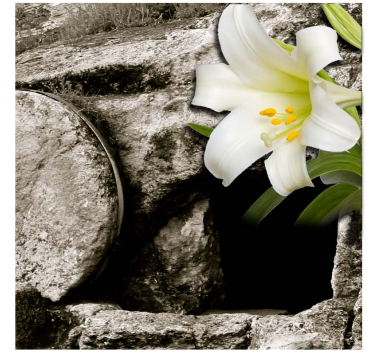
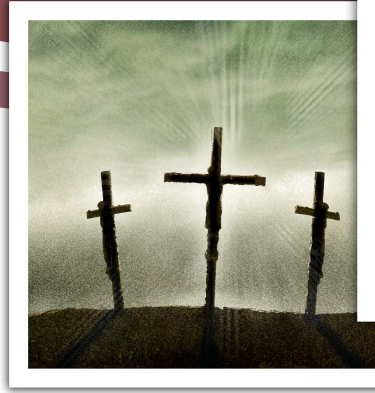


# BLESSED *Easter!*

## NEWS FROM THE MISSION FIELD

### Missionary Work in East Ukraine

*"At this time, there are 31 missionaries, supported by Good Samaritan, ministering in E. Ukraine. Missionaries help people in the church, lead the children's ministry, and visit surrounding villages and cities where new churches have been planted or hope to be planted.*

*In Pryluky, the remodel of the Christian Center is still in process. Currently, a 3 month Bible School is being held there. After graduation, students will go to various new church plants for ministry. The church has a Sunday School program for the children, who eagerly attend. Also, the missionaries teach a Christian ethics class at a public school, which is greatly enjoyed.*

*We help needy children, as we are able, inviting them to church and holding special services for them, after which they receive small gifts. We have also been invited to work with the orphanage in the city. Our desire is to bring joy and happiness to children who need it so much.*



*We travel to nearby cities to hold church services. At this time, the work is being done in four villages. People receive us gratefully. While the Bible School is going on, we plan to hold outreach services in several new villages, with the hope of organizing new churches. Graduating students will be able to continue ministry there.*

*At the church we have an active Women's ministry and ministry to young couples. People with various questions and issues come for counseling, support and fellowship. Our desire is to be light in the world, to be fruitful and glorify His Name! "*

# WEST UKRAINE



One of the families who work with our 'Happy Family' orphanage, Igor and Larisa Primak, care for a 13 year old girl named Veronika. She was born with a spinal deformity which is rapidly becoming a problem needing surgery; 10 screws to be placed for stabilization and other medical treatment. She is having difficulties going to school, and with her internal organs. The director of Good Samaritan, Rostik Borishkevich, in Ukraine is asking us to help this family, as they cannot afford the costs and to please pray for Veronika and the family as they go through this difficult time.

Every year in Ukraine from Spring through the Summer, tent evangelistic services are held. This form of evangelism is efficient and convenient, as the tent can be transported and placed almost anywhere, gathering in up to 1000 people. Especially unbelievers are drawn to the tent services which are held in the daytime. There they hear the beautiful singing, testimonies and preaching. Special children's programs are organized as well. During the summer vacation children like to hear the Bible Stories and learn Christian songs. The older children like to be involved in discussions on various issues. This year, as in the previous years, a series of tent evangelism meetings are scheduled to take place in many regions of Ukraine.

## NORTHEAST RUSSIA

Our dear missionary friends, Yuriy and Natasha Golub are currently residing in the Magadan region, (same latitude as Anchorage, AK) They grew up there, but now live in WA state. Yuriy's email shares about his trip to four villages where ethnic people called Koryak and Eveni live.

"These ethnic villages have 60-100 people living in them and the conditions are very harsh. Some have no electricity because the diesel electro stations are broken. Those who have electricity receive it only a few hours a day. They get water from the ice on the river. Food is prepared on wood stoves, for which they need to collect wood from the forest sometimes 3 miles from the village. They use husky dogs for hauling heavy things. Their main food is fish, both summer and winter and much time is spent preserving it. From their life of hopelessness and lack of purpose, people drink alcohol to excess. But, Praise God, the Gospel has reached these people in far off places. People have left their sinful ways. God has freed them from alcoholism, addiction to cigarettes, sexual immorality and depravity.

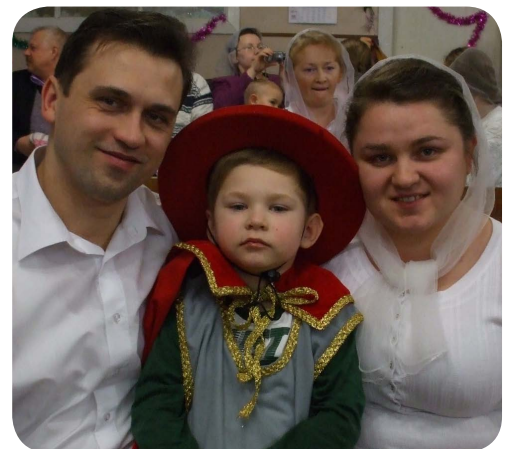
Since 1997, Yuriy Diky, originally from Ukraine, supported by "Good Samaritan", has been ministering there. In Evensk, there are approximately 20 church members; in Verh-Paren, 7 church members; in Ust-Paren, two lady believers. In Evensk, about 35 people come to the church services, plus 35-40 children.

Praise God, the words of Jesus Christ are being fulfilled-the Gospel is being preached to the ends of the earth. Our journey was on a very bad road (if you can call it a road) that can be traveled on using only ATVs. For example, we drove from Evensk to Verh-Paren (150 mi) 18 hours and part of the way from Verh-Paren to Topolovka (150 mi) took 26.5 hours. A severe snowstorm started, visibility was zero, and the wipers couldn't clear the snow, so we had to use our GPS. Thank God we didn't fall through the ice or fall off a cliff, as these risks were real. The Lord was with us! Praise Him!
